**Associate Professor Sanjay Warriar** is a Consultant Breast Oncology and Oncoplastic Surgeon at Chris O'Brien Lifecare, Royal Prince Alfred and Mater Hospitals. He is also a Visiting Medical Officer at BreastScreen NSW. He is an Associate Professor of the University of Sydney with the Royal Prince Alfred Academic Institute. He is Immediate Past President and Councillor, and co-chair of post fellowship training at Breast Surg ANZ. He is the Site director of surgical training at RPAH positions. A/Prof. Warriar is also lead researcher at the Lifecare centre with research interests in minimizing surgical breast reconstructive complications and incorporating innovative technology into breast surgery.



**Dr Simon Overstall** is a Specialist Plastic Surgeon, a fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons (FRACS) and a member of the Australian Society of Plastic Surgeons (ASPS). Dr. Overstall has established private practice at Cabrini Hospital, Malvern. His scope of practice includes skin cancer, breast surgery (reconstruction, reduction, mastopexy, asymmetry), elective and emergency hand surgery as well as a broad range of cosmetic procedures. Dr. Overstall has public hospital appointments at both the Royal Melbourne hospital as well as the Monash Health network of hospitals. Dr. Overstall has written numerous articles that have been published in peer reviewed medical journals and he has written four text books that have been published by the Royal Society of Medicine press.
